# **SERVICES:**

## CONSULTATION AND EDUCATION

School social workers confer with school personnel to sensitize administrators and teachers to the various student -family school - community relations which affect a student's academic performance. Providing consultation at the school level, social workers aim to enhance classroom/ school climate for success, promote optimal learning, improve interpersonal skills and alleviate barriers to school adjustment.

# DIRECT SERVICES TO STUDENTS & FAMILIES

School social workers provide supportive counseling and mental health skill building to individual students, groups of students, and families. They screen and assess students to determine the appropriate level of care for school treatment intervention and possibly referrals to community mental health agencies; as well as serving as a liaison between school and community agencies.

In addition, they work with students who are facing a variety of challenges, such as truancy, social anxiety, depression, self-harm, aggressive behaviors, substance abuse problems, bullying, eating disorders, mood dysregulation, attention and concentration, early psychosis, sexual identity issues, and peer relationship problems. They also work with students to address immediate concerns, such as coping with stress, parental divorce, school avoidance, and grief and loss issues.

School social workers provide crisis intervention and/or therapeutic services to students by initiating a screening and then, if needed, connecting the student to a crisis assessment, in collaboration with community emergency services.
